■ Road Safety:

To ensure that local roads and footpaths are safe for all users.

■ Green Environment

Whilst we all understand the need to build homes, our local Green Belt is a critical 'lung' in all our lives. I will continue to support and protect the Green Belt.

As a resident of the area, I understand the concerns about the Eco Park. I support Surrey County Council's decision to take legal action against the contractor and will continue to campaign to have the gasifier and its stack removed.



■ Flooding:

Recent flooding has again shown how vulnerable our riverside properties are in extreme conditions. I support the Lower Thames Relief Scheme and will press for further protection for Sunbury.

■ Make Spelthorne Zone 6 Campaign

Sunbury and Halliford are home to three stations: Kempton Park, Sunbury and Upper Halliford station. Not one of these train stations is currently in Zone 6. It is long overdue, so I will continue to lobby relevant authorities and South Western Railway to extend Zone 6 as far as Shepperton"

NEWS IN BRIEF

Surrey recently launched a project to plant 1.2 million trees in Surrey by 2030. Buddhi recently launched an online survey to ask residents where thev wanted new native trees to be planted. Following the many responses received from residents, Tim Evans ordered additional has trees to be planted on the following roads.

Maryland Way, Queensway, Brackenwood, Hawkewood Road Upper Halliford Road, Haslett Road and Chestnut Walk Buddhi worked closely with Tim for cleaner and greener roads and footpaths. As part of this campaign, Upper Halliford Station Road and the Footpath from Nursery Road to the Station have been cleared resulting in many positive comments from residents.









Gaston Bridge Road- Halliford Road Improvements

Cllr Tim Evans recently commissioned road safety improvement work at the junction of Halliford Road with Gaston Bridge Road. This comprised widening the footpath, improving the central island and installing tactile paving on both footways.







Charlton Lane Road Resurfacing in early June


Surrey has confirmed that resurfacing on Charlton Lane will be carried out in early June and we will have the knee rail on the footway repaired at the same time.

£ 2000 relaunch grant for The Sunbury Fuel Allotment Trust

The Sunbury Fuel Allotment Trust, founded in 1921 to alleviate fuel poverty in Lower Sunbury had been inactive in recent years but has been now been revived, helped by a £2000 relaunch grant from Surrey County Council's Members' Community Allocation funding supported by County Councillor Tim Evans.
