# Irresponsible parking near Beauclerc School on French Street

Residents have raised concerns about parents who park on the corner of French Street and Elizabeth Gardens on the pavement with obvious inconvenience and dangers.

Surrey County Council carried out a "Road Safety Outside School" investigation.

The Officers recommend that the school need to register with ModeShift STARS and work towards completing a Bronze accredited Travel Plan.

However, due to the limited number of parking bays in The Avenue and as requested by the local business community, Surrey CC has been asked to look again at the locations to install EVCP.

# **Planning**

### Benwell Phase 2 defeated thanks to the Conservatives

This proposed development, widely criticised in Sunbury, and opposed by the Conservatives but backed by the current Lib Dem, Green, Harveyite Administration, was defeated at a recent meeting of the Spelthorne Borough Council Planning Committee, with Sunbury "Independent" Councillor Helen Harvey defying local opinion and voting for it to be built. Without the three Conservatives voting against this dreadful proposal, we would have ended up with a monstrosity.

## 36/38 Minsterley Avenue- Planning Application

Residents in Minsterley Avenue have been very pleased to note that Spelthorne Planning Committee unanimously rejected the planning application of 36/38 Minsterley Avenue. Although it is not county councillors' responsibility, at the request of residents, Buddhi contacted Surrey Highways teams, raised the profile of the case, discussed residents' concerns with the ward councillors and shared residents' concerns with fellow conservative councillors who took an informed decision.

## Children and Youth

Buddhi says, "Having three children of my own I will work very closely with the school leaders and governors of all schools in Lower Sunbury to ensure our children get access to all services provided by Surrey CC so that schools can provide the quality education which our children deserve."

Our schools are truly inclusive and I appreciate the dedication of the schools' leaders who support our children in need and I have already been discussing issues relating to Education, Health Care Plans (EHCPs) and the Special Education Need and Disabilities (SEND) provision. Accordingly I arranged a visit from the Director of Education and Lifelong Learning of Surrey CC to meet the Head of one of our local schools to discuss funding for EHCP/SEND provisions.

Separately I met with the Surrey County Council Strategic Commissioning Manager (Youth Provision) to discuss Surrey's Family Resilience Universal Youth Offer and plans for our young people. It was also great to talk to the CEO of Surrey Clubs for Young People about how best to support the Sunbury Youth Centre."

# **Local Business**

The Covid- 19 pandemic has presented an unprecedented challenge to many businesses and self-employed people here in Sunbury and Halliford. With our local shops it really is a question of "Use it or Lose it"

Buddhi has been tireless in his efforts to create a platform for local businesses in Sunbury and Halliford to come together, to discuss the issues that they all face.




# Conservatives serving Sunbury since 1885!
